



## FACT SHEET

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- Homes for the Holidays (HFTH), a program of the Warrick Dunn Charities, was established in 1997 in Tampa, Fla.
- The mission of HFTH is to provide opportunities for economically disadvantaged single-parents and children who have demonstrated a commitment to achieve financial independence and stability.
- HFTH provides \$5,000 in down payment assistance for single-parents who have qualified for a home through Habitat for Humanity.
- Single parents who are also first time homeowners are nominated to WDC in a closed nomination process and must have completed required pre-qualification criteria, such as financial literacy and sweat equity hours, to be eligible for consideration.
- HFTH, through its presenting sponsor Aaron's, Inc. (NYSE: AAN) provides furniture for every room. In addition, HFTH fundraises to fill and stage the home with all the necessities a homebuyer might need. The home is then presented in a surprise reveal, hosted by Warrick Dunn personally. Items included in the home presentation include:

Dishes & cookware	Lawn & garden equipment
Appliances	Fully stocked pantry
Linens	Cleaning supplies
- To date, HFTH has rewarded 111 single parents and 295 children and dependents.
  - 44 mothers, one father, one grandmother and 124 children & dependents in Tampa, Fla.
  - 30 mothers and 84 children & dependents in Baton Rouge, La.
  - 32 mothers and 79 children & dependents in Atlanta, Ga.
  - One father, two mothers and 10 children in Tallahassee, Fla.
- In 1998, the program expanded to include families in Dunn's hometown of Baton Rouge, La.
- In 2002, WDC was established as a way to expand programs to the Greater Atlanta area where Warrick Dunn had recently signed with the Atlanta Falcons.
- In 2007, HFTH began to include families in Tallahassee, Fla. where Dunn attended The Florida State University.
